Robust Member and Caregiver Support

Our integrated mental health resources include peer-based programs led by fellow cancer survivors through Cancer Connect, and every Care Advocate is standing ready to connect members to resources like ACS's patient resources like Road to Recovery and ACS CARES. Additionally, our Care Advocates offer financial hardship support, and can help members understand their cancer-related expenses, find and enroll in assistance programs, and manage or contest bills.

And, when survivors are ready to come back to work, our Care Advocates work with members and People teams to support transitions back to the workplace - and continue to support ongoing concerns and needs once they've returned.




